## The Bradley Lessa Memorial Playground

(formerly known as the West Complex)

The Recreation Department maintains and issues permits for the twelve acre sports complex located between the West Elementary School and O'Donnell Middle School. The complex features four softball fields, two baseball fields, a gravel walking circuit, and a comfort station for your convenience. It is home for both interscholastic high school sports and Stoughton youth sports.

## Ames Long Pond Beachfront

Ames Long Pond, located on Highland Street on the Stoughton/Easton border, is the location for the Town's supervised swimming program. Significantly removed from the hustle and bustle of downtown, the beach is located in a distinctly country setting. Bordered by shade trees, the beach area is a welcoming spot to beat the heat, especially for families with young children and senior citizens. Amenities include public bathrooms and a dock system. Water quality is tested weekly during the months of June, July, and August.
